

Riley Announces a Ten-Year Plan to Better Serve the Children of Indiana

The Riley Strategic Planning Process has produced a five-point plan that includes, "a reorganization of Clarian's pediatric services, a comprehensive and strategic statewide strategy, announcement of Phase V, aggressive recruitment of world class clinicians and researchers, and major contributions to the life sciences sector through great collaboration with Biocrossroads and related industry partners"

The reorganization of pediatric services will brand all Clarian pediatrics with Riley. The comprehensive statewide strategy will increase access to Riley sub specialty care across Indiana. This includes expanding Indiana telemedicine partners.

Phase V calls for a 10-story building to expand Riley Hospital to over 400 beds. The goal of the 10-year plan is to better coordinate care for Indiana kids at Riley. Read the full Indy Star article [here](#).

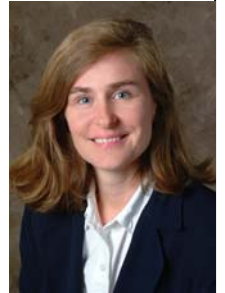
"Officials representing the Indiana Medicaid office will be coming to observe a live interactive patient consult. Other state programs have demonstrated significant transportation cost savings."
